A fine example of a quarried pit where the pea-gravel has been removed and a water store has been built in-situ. Note the stone faced sides to the water store backed by non-porous clay.





This shot shows part of the extensive waterways and sluices discovered on site. It was only after discovering that the sluices ran away from the ancient roadway exposed by the dig that Field Unit member Bob Hatton ventured the theory that the area may have had an industrial use - possibly in the cleaning of sheep fleeces.
